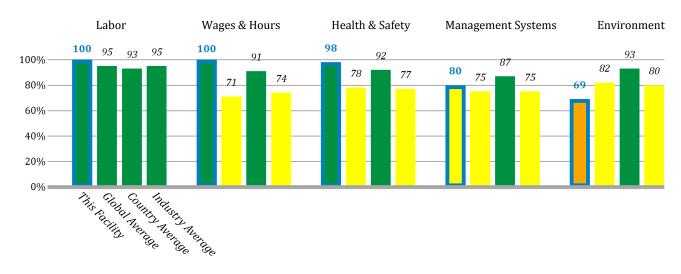

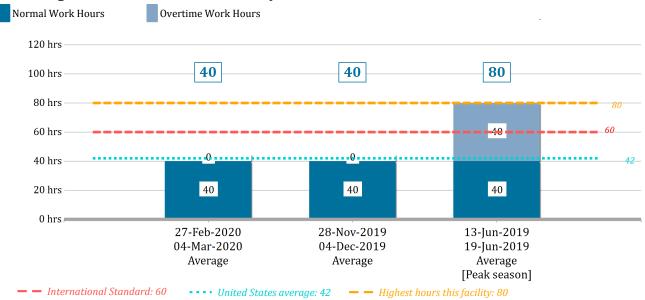

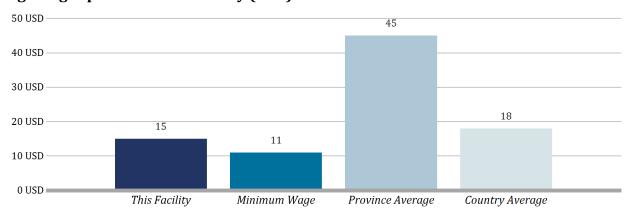

Average wages paid in local currency (USD)



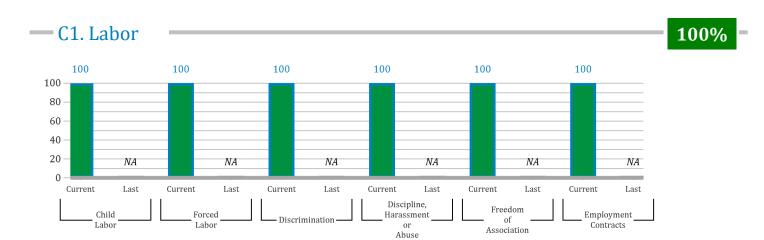
